## TEA

### Drum Mountain White Cloud \$4

White Tea - Fujian Province, China

*This fragrant tea shows a beautifully sweet nose redolent of almonds and coconut.*

### White Peony \$8

White Tea - Fujian Province, China

*This delicate, expressive tea is grown on coastal, terraced hills. Clear and sweet with a lingering bean sprout character.*

### Karigane Kukicha \$8

Green Tea - Uji, Japan

*This traditional Japanese twig tea represents a style of green tea that is almost unknown in the west. The tea displays itself in a beautiful jade green. Subtle and refined in it's notes of fresh grass and marzipan. The finish is subtle, deep and clean.*

### Jasmine Pearls \$9

Green Tea - Fujian Province, China

*Crafted from spring-picked, southern Chinese green tea and fresh jasmine blossoms, each intensely floral pearl is carefully rolled and then dried.*

### Oriental Beauty \$8

Oolong Tea - Shintsu County, Taiwan

*An interesting tea, with a combination of the complexities of an oolong in taste and aroma, but the appearance and strength of a black tea.*

### Ceylon High-Grown \$6

Black Tea - Nuwara Eliya Region, Sri Lanka

*From the famed Tommagong Estate, this black tea is produced in mountain fields at over 6,000 feet. This coarse, reddish copper colored leaf produces a wonderfully expressive black tea with lingering floral notes of blue and white flowers. Lingering flavors on the palate finish with a clean, stately elegance.*

### Lapsang Souchong \$7

Black Tea – Fujian Province, China

*Older plants and more care in the smoking process improve the quality, while a leaf that is lightly smoked in bamboo trays produce a tea that is far more subtle and refined.*

### Pu-erh Leaf \$6

Pu-erh Tea - Yunnan Province, China

*Produced with a post-fermentation process unique to all the pu-erh teas. The flavor is rich and strong - often well liked by coffee drinkers.*

### Chamomile \$5

Tisane - Egypt

*This old favorite is well known for its calming properties. Notes of fig and honey make for a soothing brew.*

### Wild Mint \$5

Tisane - Armenia

*Drunk after meals as a digestive for centuries, mint is a popular caffeine-free alternative to tea.*
